We're really happy that you're joining us for the first ever Camp Casual. It's going to be a super awesomely fun and unique weekend. DIRECTIONS FROM MELBOURNE

You're going to a sweet little property at 1725 Wild Dog Valley Rd, South Gippsland.

BY CAR (From Melbourne)

The best place to pick up groceries, booze and ice along the way is Warragul.

- Take the M1 east from Melbourne
- Turn off at the second sign to Warragul, and turn right into the Warragul-Korumburra Road
- Keep going for 26.2 kilometres (set your odometer to assist you)
- Turn left into Ross and Witherdons Rd
- Keep going for 5.4 k's
- Turn left into Wild Dog Valley Rd
- 2 kilometres up this track you'll see the barn on the left, and then you'll come to the gate You've made it! Now you can pull up at the gate, get your wristbands sorted, offload your friends and all your gear THEN Turn back around and drive 2 mins to the carpark paddock

BY BUS (From Southern Cross Station)

If you don't have wheels, you can get the V-Line bus service to Leongatha, and the FREE Camp Casual shuttle will whisk you away to the property. IF YOU'D LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPTION PLEASE E-MAIL US THE NUMBER IN YOUR CREW TO info@campcasual.com.au with SHUTTLE in the subject line.

Shuttle timetable:

Friday 27 February, take the V-Line bus service from Southern Cross Station, Melbourne, at 1:10pm. You'll arrive in Leongatha at 3:23pm and our shuttle will meet you at the bus stop. Shuttle number 0409673500

On Monday 2 March, the shuttle heads off from Camp Casual in the morning in time to get you to the Leongatha stop for a 10:30 am departure for Melbourne.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT CAMP CASUAL

- You can arrive any time after midday on Friday 27 February. MUSIC BEGINS AT 5pm!!
- Bring a hard or soft copy of your ticket so we can cross you off the list at the gate and give you a wrist band
- For safety reasons and to preserve the luscious property where we'll be frolicking all weekend, you **won't be able to camp with you car**. You can park in a paddock about 10 mins walk from the Camp site, but you can drop your stuff off at the gate first so you don't have to lug it along with you
- There are food and coffee vendors on site. **Booze is BYO (we got ICE for SALE)**, and food can also be BYO'd, but please note there's a total fire ban which means no cooking, and we ask you not to bring in any glass
- There is fresh, potable tank water available on-site bring a drink bottle you can refill
- We're hoping for glorious sunny days, but you'll want to bring plenty of warm gear too because it could deeefinitely get cold at night
- You should also **bring your bathers** so you can take a dip in the spring-fed dam while being serenaded by the very best local electronic acts
- Bring a tent! You can't sleep in your car on-site, and if you opt for an under-the-stars experience you'll be mauled by a wombat (not really), so please remember your temporary shelter
- No animals sorry (sorry animals)
- Music will finish up on Sunday as the sun sets over the rolling hills, and if you're good to drive you can head home then, or you can stay over on Sunday night too for no extra charge.

THINGS TO BRING

- ☼ Your tent
- ☼ Your ticket
- Sleeping bag or blankie
- Torch!
- Warm things to wear at night
- Warm sleeping bags, blankets, doonas
- Good outdoor shoes you have to walk a bit to get to the dam stage. It's doable in thongs but better in sneakers
- ☼ Not glass
- Cash, lot's of cash! the food vendors will not have card facilities
- Insect repellent
- A spare battery for anything that needs a battery
- There's no phone reception except for 'Information Super Highway Hill' location inbetween main camp area and the DAM STAGE
- Medications and first aid bits and pieces you might need think antihistamines, gastrolyte, painkillers, etc. There are basic first aid kits on-site but they don't have pharmaceuticals in them.


CONTACT DETAILS
